MCDP Nominates Humphrey for County Commission; Welcomes Guest Speakers

Columbia, TN: The Maury County Democratic Party held its "Donuts with the Democrats" meeting on Saturday, March 26, at the Maury County Senior Citizens' Center.

Jeremy Humphrey, who is running for County Commission in District 7, was nominated by a caucus vote of the MCDP Executive Committee. Humphrey will be the first Democratic candidate for a county office in Maury County in several decades. Mr. Humphrey currently works for the City of Columbia and is a long-time resident of Santa Fe.

The MCDP also welcomed several guest speakers, notably including:

- Jameson Manor, a teacher at Culleoka Unit School, who is planning to challenge Rep.
 Scott Cepicky (R-Culleoka) in the 64th State House District.
- David Carson, a small business owner from Mt. Pleasant who is considering a run for the 71st State House District. This seat is currently held by Rep. David Byrd (R-Waynesboro) who has declined to seek re-election.
- State Senator Heidi Campbell (D-Nashville), who visited as a friend-of-the-Party.
- Judicial candidates Stacie Odeneal and Lee Brooks, both Independents, who are seeking Circuit Court positions. Neither Ms. Odeneal nor Mr. Brooks participated in the party caucus. Both candidates stated a desire to keep politics out of judicial elections, a position widely agreed upon by those present, and spoke about their qualifications.
- Several Independent candidates for County Commission, who were our guests and did not seek our nomination and did not participate in our caucus.

The MCDP will hold its next meeting on Tuesday, April 12 at 6:30 p.m. at the Fairview Park Recreation Center in Columbia.
