
DJ Campos Ty Cobb Young Democrat




Denise Durica - Secretary





"PaBob" Archer grew up in a large blue-collar family and played on the champion 1947 Dobbyns-Bennett High School varsity football team (that went 11-0, out-scoring their opponents 260-6). After serving in the Army during the Korean War, Bob worked his way up from counting paper rolls on the factory floor to become one of the senior accountants for the Kingsport Mead Paper Mill. He was a golfer, a Methodist, a Democrat, and had a generous and loving heart and a passion for fair play.

"Bubba" Dallas was the son of a Canadian-born Presbyterian minister who grew up in Knoxville. He was a Boy Scout, a Naval Flight Surgeon, and a University of Tennessee-educated physician who for many years worked in the Emergency Room at Holston Valley Hospital in Kingsport. John was an "old school" Republican who believed in discipline, charity, and the importance of education and human reason.




