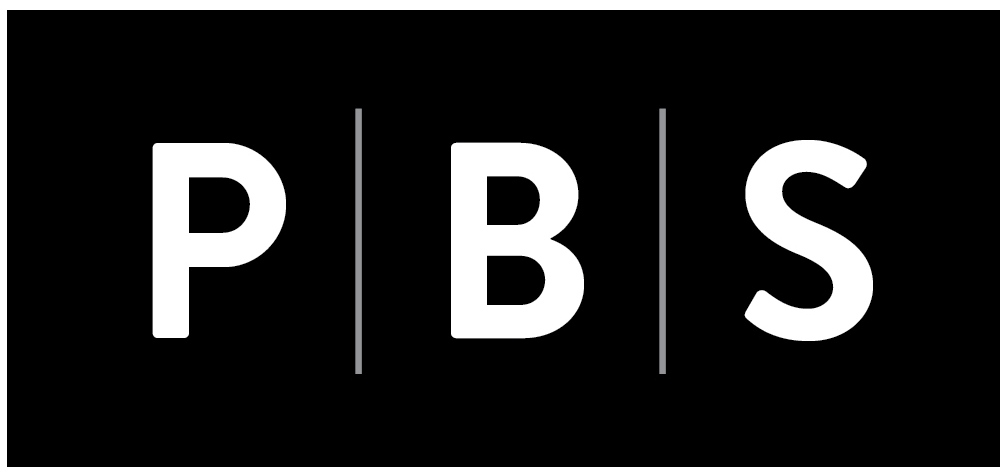

Throughout her career, Kaliente has gone beyond her formal role to strengthen relationships between schools and families. She has chaired Family Night events, coordinated Career Day programs, led student success incentive campaigns, and raised funds to support Family Resource Centers and school initiatives. Kaliente has also served as student council advisor at Randolph Howell Elementary and Whitthorne Middle School.
